Practice 6pm on Friday 2		ield preparation permitting; practice targets will be available on the tournament field from 5pm to 26^{th} of June 2020. Please do not enter the field of play to erect tents before 4:30pm on Friday and consent of the working party.		
Registration & Bow inspection	Gates open at 7:15am with registration from 7.30am on both days. Membership cards will be required for registration. If you are not yet in possession of a 2019/2020 card, please bring proof that you have paid your membership to your club. Equipment inspection will be carried out prior to the start of practice.			
Event Timings	Saturday & Sunday: Assembly at 8:15am followed by up to 45 minutes of practice. Competition begins at 9am			
Event Format	Saturday WA 70m round for recurve, barebow and longbow shot on a 122cm full face WA 60m round for recurve, barebow and longbow cadets & masters shot on a 122cm full face WA 50m round for all compounds with each archer shooting their own 80cm 6-ring face. These ranking rounds will be shot in double detail with six arrows shot in four minutes. A series of Head-to-Head matches will follow this. Although it is hoped that all archers will go through to the Head to Head stage a cut may be applied depending on entries and timing. Higher placed archers may receive a bye in the earlier rounds. Note: Barebow and Longbow archers are welcome to shoot the Head-to-Head, however they will be classified as, and therefore shoot alongside, recurve archers. Sunday WA 1440 (Gentlemen), WA 1440 (Ladies) rounds plus Metrics I-V All rounds will be shot in double detail with six arrows shot in four minutes throughout the day. Compounds will shoot on individual six-zone 80cm faces at 50m and 30m Recurves will shoot on 80cm full faces at 50m, then two horizontally aligned six-zone 80cm faces at 30m. Barebow and Longbow archers will shoot on 80cm full faces at both 50m and 30m. Metric rounds will be shot on full faces throughout.

Shooting Rules	The tournamen	The tournament will be shot to World Archery rules in force at the time of the event.		
Dress regulations		Please refer to Archery GB's rules of shooting for dress regulations (rule 307 will apply). Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations.

Drug Testing	Archers competing at record status tournaments may be liable for drugs testing. Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply. Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result. Parents / Guardians must sign the relevant box on the entry forms giving consent for junior archers (under 18's) to be drug tested if approached.	
Lost Arrows	Lost arrows must be reported to a judge or member of the field party (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow). It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field.	
Photography	In line with Archery GB policy, anyone wishing to take video or photographs during the event must register their details with tournament organiser. If parents/carers have any concerns about their child/young person being photographed or filmed they should notify the organisers. The organisers reserve the right to decline entry to any person unable to meet or abide by these conditions.	
Refreshments	Refreshments will be available on both days by kind arrangement of Girton College.	
Camping	Camping is not permitted at the venue. However several commercial operators who cater for tents, caravans and motorhomes are available within 15 minutes of the tournament venue. Bosses	Tenzone Targets layered foam bosses will be used for all classes	
Special Note	Please ensure that the organiser is aware of any special requirements you may have. Archers who are unable to get to the target are requested, if possible, to arrange for an assistant to aid in scoring and arrow collection. If this is not possible, please contact the organiser for advice.	
Smoking	As the tournament is held on college premises, smoking is not permitted anywhere except designated smoking areas which are clearly signed. Please note this rule also applies to those using electronic cigarettes or vaping.	
Stoves, burners etc.	Because of the risk of fire, the use of stoves, burners or BBQ's is strictly forbidden.	
Pets	Animals, other than assistance animals such as guide dogs, are not permitted.	
Parking	Ample parking is available at the event. Those with limited mobility should contact the organisers in advance to discuss parking options.	
Documentation	Archery GB GDPR compliance statement:- When you enter competitions the following information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and other competitors for example target lists and results may be published: First Name, Surname, Gender, Bow style, Date of Birth / Age category, Email, Address, Phone number, Club (and ID), County (and ID), Region (and ID), Round (unless defined by age), Disabled (Y/N), Disability info." Target lists, results and other instructions will be available via Peacock Archers (peacock-archers.org) If you prefer a printed copy, please enclose two stamped self-addressed envelopes with your entry.	
Entry Fees	Seniors (18yrs or over) £19 per day, £35 for both days Juniors (under 18yrs) £17 per day, £31 for both days Priority will be given for those entering both days or juniors entering age appropriate rounds on the Sunday. Places will not be reserved without payment. A waiting list will be in operation as soon as all places have been filled. Booking via Eventbrite attracts a small fee, included in the price shown online.
